(Talking in hallway)

DR: Right here.

DK: Right here Eric.

CA: (inaudible)

DR: The restroom is right there.

CA: Okay

CE: And an elevator

DR: This is brand new actually.

CA: Oh, it is?

?: Yes this is all brand new.

CE: This seems a little cold. But let me ah, get those arrest warrants so if you'll give me a minute.

CA: That's fine.

CE: And then we'll get you a phone and we'll call your attorney.

CA: Okay

CE: Okay

(Corporal Edwards left the room)

ASB: And I will sit here with you.

CA: Alright

CE: Water?

CA: No, I'm fine.

AS: I don't know if I should apologize for what happened on the highway or not, but...

CA: I almost feel like I should in a sense but I don't think...yeah, I know for a fact that he didn't know. So I don't think that it was intentional on anybody's part for any of it so..

ASB: Yeah

CA: I don't that didn't look good but I mean...

AS: Yeah

CA: ...you can understand why.

ASB: I know one thing, if I got caught doing that I would've kept my ticket and

(inaudible)

CA: (laugh)

ASB: (inaudible)...especially when they found out I was a federal agent.

CA: Oh

ASB: Oh really you driving like that around here. Get your ass in my car.

Ca: Yeah, well...

ASB: It's kind of how

CA:...we figured going through the airport, its restricted airspace so they can't take the helicopters through. And we thought that the cars following us from my attorney's office were media.

ASB: Yeah

CA: Because there's a media van that followed us and other van that went with them. So we're thinking, oh shit, here we go.

ASB: Uh-huh (affirmative)

CA: It's happened before. It happens every day.

ASB: I know it does.

CA: So

ASB: I know it does. I'd like to make it stop happening to be honest with you.

CA: I would too

(chuckle)

ASB: Well you know what I'll say to that?

CA: (no verbal response)

ASB: I've said that to your Mom, I've said it to your Dad I've said it to your brother even.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: You know.

CA: Well that was one thing that they all agreed upon was the fact that you know you extended your hand out. Most people haven't. So.

ASB: Right. I was afraid that some of what I said to them probably offended them because I told them that if I find out something that you don't want to hear.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: I'm gonna tell you anyway.

CA: Well...

ASB: Just because

CA: ...honestly they respect that that's just you know...

ASB: Yeah

CA: ...the type of people that they are. I'm the same way.

ASB: I know. I know they are, but ah, when I hit 'em with certain things they don't hear. And I understand that.

CA: Yeah well

ASB: It doesn't mean I'm not gonna say...

CA: Exactly. We know different beliefs and somebody it's just hard sometimes to hear their opinion. But...

ASB: That's true.

CA: ...that doesn't mean that they don't respect your opinion or the fact that you're coming forward with what you think or what you feel, so...

ASB: Yeah. Well to some extent it's comforting to hear you say that because it was never my intention to piss anybody in your family off.

CA: Yeah

ASB: You know I'm not in it to get a conviction. I get nothing out of it. I get zero.

CA: Exactly. Even on the job you're trying to do.

ASB: Right

CA: You know

ASB: I found a few and I...

CA: Yeah

ASB: not a few and it sucked both ways.

CA: Yeah I agree.

ASB: So...it is what it is.

CA: Yeah

ASB: Where I get side...where I get sideways with people.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: Tends to be when attorneys get involved.

CA: I've heard most people say that. They don't like attorneys very much.

ASB: I had, I had many family members that are attorneys, I have no problem with attorneys. What I have problems with are at some point...

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: We have to set aside the rules and we have to find kids. And you know what? So be it that's why I told you in the car. You know if you tell me anything now.

CA: Yeah

ASB: I'll get up and say, yep I heard it and she's already invoked so we can't use any of it. That's just the way it is that's all that matters to me.

CA: Yeah.

ASB: And ah, you know when we did, did another case that I was involved in. You know they lost a confession. And I sat there and I looked right at the guys that we worked with I said...

CA: That's not what's important.

ASB: Who cares?

CA: Yeah.

ASB: We found her. We found her and he's gonna get what's coming to him that's not my job.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: You know. And it works out in the end. It works out in the end on all sides.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: To be honest with you. It may not be comfortable for everyone.

CA: Yeah

ASB: But if I've done things that I get caught for. I'm not gonna I'm not gonna be comfortable I can tell you that.

(laugh)

ASB: That's just the way life is. You know but it's not the end of the road either. And that's just what we have to keep in mind it's not the end of the road you know.

CA: Just a random question.

ASB: Shoot

CA: Um, are there cameras in all of the rooms, or just some of them?

ASB: I have no frigging clue. I've never been in this part of the building so I...

CA: Well I know that (inaudible)

ASB: My guess would be yes.

DR: We're gonna get something to drink. Do you want soda, mountain dew, diet pepsi?

CA: Nothing

ASB: No I'm fine.

CA: I'm good.

ASB: Thank you very much

CA: I know my Mom is...

ASB: I would guess yes

CA: Yeah, that's what I was thinking to. Well my Mom wasn't aware that there was a camera in the room I guess when she met with Melich and I forget who else. And the big interviews were released to the media and she was infuriated.

ASB: Uh-huh (affirmative)

CA: You would think that that's something that you know you should be told. But you don't have to be.

ASB: Right

CA: (laugh)

ASB: The law is the law.

CA: Yeah

ASB: And I will play within the rules of the law.

CA: Yeah

ASB: If, if it's a tool that's available to me that I can use later to look back on and see if I missed something or could I have done something better. I'm gonna take advantage of it.

CA: Yeah exactly.

ASB: I would assume that this place probably has one somewhere.

CA: Oh easily

ASB: ...around here.

CA: It would be something that records audio so either way.

ASB: Yeah I could tell you (inaudible)

CA: laugh

ASB: (inaudible) Um yeah, they'll probably be somewhat unhappy when they see my interviews with 'em. Those haven't been released yet but they were on video.

CA: Yeah well that's just part of discovery so.

ASB: Yeah it'll all come out.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: You know. But, ah like I said I have loyalty to one person in every one of these cases and it doesn't happen to be anyone that I'm interviewing usually.

CA: Understand

ASB: It's not a, it's not a slight on them. You know I've dealt with many different people in many different positions.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: None of which are comfortable and those things always get in the way that you have on your... hands.

CA: (no verbal response)

ASB: You know. Such are the rules that we work under.

CA: Yeah here's my question.

ASB: Sure

CA: Um, I know this is a question that a lot of people have asked. The Grand Jury and all that is supposed to be secret. But it was released to the media right off the bat. My Dad hadn't even been subpoenaed and that was released. So I just think a lot of that is kind of funny. And the fact that they invited the media in when they were releasing the decision. My Mom had received a text message from someone....

ASB: Someone in the media.

CA: In the media, yeah... Saying they're (inaudible) ...all of a sudden they make the decision. We're thinking, are you serious?

ASB: There are rules.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: I'm quite sure that one of the rules that was followed was that when the decision to indict has been made.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: Um, that part of it is public.

CA: Yeah, that part is public.

ASB: And they can let the media into the court room at that point.

CA: Yeah

ASB: I bet, this is just is my bet. I don't know what the Florida rules are I'm...

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: ...more federal stuff, familiar with that.

CA: Yeah

ASB: But what I bet is that it was done under seal.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmatives)

ASB: And there was no names and no official charges probably read aloud.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: It probably just was there's an indictment been received in a case and that's it.

CA: Well when the media was out there all day and they knew about this a week ago, that it was gonna happen.

ASB: Yeah

CA: So it's just kind of funny. It's supposed to be secret and...

ASB: The...the

CA: ...everything was ...

ASB: The happenings...

CA: released.

ASB: The happenings are secret.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: What takes place within the room is secret.

CA: Yeah. But as far as when it actually is convened and you know pulled together and the witnesses and stuff like that, that's not all supposed to be secret?

ASB: It depends on how they're subpoenaed

CA: Okay

ASB: I mean if you're subpoenaed under a regular court order. That's a (inaudible).

CA: My Dad was through his attorney so I'm not quite sure how that came through. Yeah I know...

ASB: But if, if the subpoena itself...

CA: Yeah

ASB: ...is just a regular (inaudible)

CA: Yeah certain things...

ASB: ...Grand Jury subpoena, that's...

CA: ...are public.

ASB: ...are public records.

CA: Yeah

ASB: It doesn't say what it's for it doesn't say what case it's in.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: It doesn't...it just says you're subpoenaed to appear before the Grand Jury.

CA: Well with them announcing that you know there's gonna be a Grand Jury and obviously my name was thrown out they knew who the Grand Jury was for.

ASB: Who threw your name out?

CA: The media said that it was from an inside source, meaning here.

ASB: I...

CA: So that's here, they all say it's...

ASB: I can tell you what I think of the media and what I think of people that leak things to the media.

CA: I think its garbage. Yeah I agree.

ASB: But...

CA: That's the best way...

ASB: But it doesn't...

CA: ...of putting it.

ASB: that doesn't make them any...less necessary.

CA: (no verbal response)

ASB: Without them...

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: I'll be quite honest, without the media we don't find a quarter of the kids that we...

CA: Oh I agree.

ASB: (inaudible)

CA: It helps, the exposure has helped bring in so many tips for my daughter.

ASB: But at the same time...

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: ...what it creates is it creates a monster that otherwise isn't necessary.

CA: Exactly

ASB: The tips are what the tips are.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: If it was a local media only

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: It would be much easier to work.

CA: Yeah

ASB: When you make it the national media then you come up with...

CA: You get the Nancy Graces.

ASB: Well you get the, well you get the tips also...

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: That come from Hawaii that say I saw Caylee.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: Oh really.

(chuckle)

ASB: Okay let me call Hawaii.

CA: (inaudible)...Georgia...

ASB: Let me send 'em out and do the...

CA: ...and the ones that are a little bit closer...

ASB: Those are, those are...

CA:...range.

ASB: ...what I consider a local. Because...

CA: Yeah

ASB: ...the local stations are...

CA: It's in close range.

ASB:...are gonna cover that.

CA: Yeah

ASB: That's contiguous to the state of Florida it's not...

CA: When people are only getting their information from the Nancy Graces or from Globe Magazine or from People or you know stuff like that. Are you kidding me.

ASB: Well I can say you will not see me trying to be interviewed by...

CA: Yeah

ASB: ..by People or Globe or anybody else. It's not gonna happen.

CA: (inaudible)

(knock)

AS: Yo

CE: Long trip...(inaudible)...my friend. Whew....that was a long ride without doing that. Then the adrenalin dump all at the same time.

ASB: Twelve people wanna know what we're talking here.

CE: You know. (pointing to Casey)

CA: I'm gonna just let that go. (laughs)

CE: No but I need to.....you gonna have.....you're not gonna break bad right?

CA: No

CE: Alright. We're gonna call him on my cell phone.

CA: Okay I know this is.....oh yeah, that's not good.

CE: Pull back there.

CA: (laugh)

CE: Just slide your hands out. No I'll go get a key.

CA: Like I honestly...

CE:...that fits.

CA: ...can't.

(all laughing)

CA: So they're a little tight.

CE: Thanks for entertaining us just slide your hands out.

ASB: Way to go Corporal Edwards

CA: Actually if I could I would have done that for you. (inaudible)

CE: You know Baez's phone number off the top of your head?

CA: No I do not.

CE: How can I get the cell number? Or his number?

CA: Um, I know his office number.

CE: What is that?

CA: Four 07...

CE: Uh-huh (affirmative)

CA: ...\*\*\*\_\*\*\*

ASB: Did you see Mr. Savage? While you were out there?

CE: Yeah you.....you want to go speak with him? And get me a handcuff key that fits.

ASB: I like that.

CE: And I'll have her make the phone call to Mr. Baez.

ASB: You do that.

CE: Now once again...

ASB: Where is he?

CE: ...He should be...

ASB: Ah, if I get there.

(laugh)

CE: ...in the office talking to the Chief.

CA: I think he needs a map to get back there.

CE: This is a rat maze.

ASB: Oh right here.

CA: He doesn't know how to get back there.

CE: I've identified myself you know why you're in custody.

CA: Yes

CE: Um, and you have you signed this, you want your attorney present.

CA: Yes

CE: Through that conversation we've agreed

CA: Yes

CE: Because express that to me again so I have full understanding before I get on the phone with him.

CA: We discussed before that we have no problem sitting down together him and I and speaking with law enforcement or listening to all the questions that you have, him and I discussing it and then we go from there, so.

CE: Okay and that's...there's been no success with that so far and you...

CA: Nobody's taken us up on that.

CE: So what we're gonna do, we're gonna open that window right now.

CA: Okay

CE: And hopefully we can make something happen. (calling Mr. Baez) 'Cause ultimately I think we have the same interest.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

CE: Finding your daughter. 2 \*\*\* you said?

CA: Yes. Thank you. (handed phone to Casey)

CA: Hey Ed its Casey. Can you do me a favour and call Jose or give me Jose's cell phone number so I can call him. Oh is he great. Thanks.

CE: How long ago was that?

CA: I was 17. 5 years.

CE: Why'd you cut your hair?

CA: Hey its Casey, I'm with Corporal...

CE: Edwards

CA: ...Corporal Edwards I knew your last name sorry. Um, I'm at the sheriff's department if you'd like to come down and meet with us. Thank you. Yes.

CE: He wants to talk to me...(inaudible)..to..

CA: Okay great thanks. (hands the phone to Corporal Edwards)

CE: Hello

CA: Yeah (laugh) give him the information.

CE: Orange County Sheriffs (talking to attorney Baez) Yeah at John Young and 50. Yeah we, we um Mr. Baez...we Mirandized her as we're....at 4:22 and she stated that you've done a great job. She invoked and, but she also said that you know that her exasperation is the same as ours. You guys wanted the opportunity to speak with law enforcement face to face. And let's.....if you guys are interested in doing that let's get that done. Quit the finger pointing okay. Alright sir. (hung up)

CA: Thanks

CE: We're game on.

ASB: Casey

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

ASB: The good looking young man that just walked in and sitting across from you is Nick Savage.

CE: What's he doing here?

ASB: He's from here.

CA: (laughs)

DR: Does anybody else need a drink?

CE: This is for you.

ASB: If it's okay with you...

DR: She didn't want a..

ASB: I'm gonna turn this...

CA: yeah that's fine

ASB: Ballgame over to him.

CA: I appreciate your help.

ASB: No problem

CA: Nice meeting you.

CE: Mr. Baez is on the way.

ASB: Alright

CR: (inaudible)

FA: (inaudible)

AS: (inaudible)

CA: I'm alright.

CE: Alright how does he spell his last?

CA: BAEZ

AS: Hard one.

CA: And to answer your other question. Um, from that picture I cut my hair it was really short even last year I just started growing it back out this year so. Yes about that.

AS: Okay

CA: (laugh)

AS: As far as Mr. Baez?

CA: He's at...

CE: Um

CA: ...the office.

CE: ...he's at the office.

AS: Okay

CE: So we have a bit of time.

AS: Okay that's fine.

CE: And we...

AS: We can (inaudible)

CE: We, ah, went through the formalities of this make sure everything is above board. And like I said before, that's what you're gonna get here okay? We just would request the same back.

CA: Yep

AS: You understand what you were arrested for today?

CA: Yes

AS: Okay

CE: May I step out for a minute?

AS: Absolutely

CE: And I'll be back.

CE: You sure you don't want anything to drink?

CA: I'm fine thank you.

AS: Handcuff key?

CE: Where'd my handcuff go?

AS: Um (inaudible)

CE: Got to...(inaudible)....pawn shop right now

CA: (laugh) Oh boy it's been a long day.  
(Corporal Edwards left the room)

AS: It has been.

CA: How was my Dad this morning?

AS: Uh, he had a hard time.

CA: Yeah

AS: Honestly

CA: I only saw from the media and got a chance to hear him talking to my Mom. I spoke to him last night and this morning for just a quick second before he left so.

AS: Yeah, I talked to him this morning for just a little bit, ah, he was with Mark and yeah he was really struggling. I mean you can imagine he was having a hard time. Ah yeah he was being called in to, essentially provide testimony to indict you.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

AS: At the least.....and he was really struggling with that.

CA: Yeah

AS: And ah I felt bad for him to be honest with you. I truly did.

CA: Well I told him last night I know he was subpoenaed and under the law he had to answer whatever questions were asked. And I told him to do what he had to do at that point. And if he didn't then he'd be held in contempt of court.

AS: Well...

CA: I don't want to see that happen so...

AS: What did he say?

CA: He just hugged me and told me that he loved me and I know that he was struggling with it even last night so...

AS: I think it was probably (inaudible) this morning.

CA: Yeah I could see that with the little bit that I saw from the media from the pictures and um, the little bit of footage that they had so..

AS: You guys watch it on TV?

CA: Oh we watched online a little bit.

AS: Really?

CA: Yeah. I try to stay away from the TV as much as possible. At least with internet I can scroll through, read what I want and get rid of it that much faster so.

AS: You anxious about today at all?

CA: Um, I have been. I mean this is something that honestly we've been preparing for from the beginning just because of words that were directly spoken by Yuri Melich and also from Sergeant Allen. So they wrote me off within the first couple of hours or so.

AS: Ah, I don't know if that's true.

CA: It was the direct words that they pretty much gave to myself and even they said that to my parents. So I mean I'm not trying to say something derogatory towards someone. But...

AS; No, okay, we're just, we're just talking.

CA: Yeah

AS: We're just chatting so...

CA: That was the only time they ever made any effort to try to talk to me one on one. And...

AS: Now it's kind of difficult..

CA: It was kind of difficult considering.

AS: All considering, obviously in light of everything that's going on and the fact that...

CA: Yeah

AS: ...you've been arrested for other things makes it a little more difficult to even sit down and talk to you.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

AS: It's not that we haven't wanted to.

CA: Yeah.

AS: Um, I certainly...

CA: I do have counsel and that's something that you know my attorney's always been a phone call away. And it shouldn't have taken it getting to this point, you know three months in.

AS: Has...

CA: For us...

AS: Has your attorney ever told you that we would like to speak with you?

CA: And we agreed him and I together that we would all sit down together him and I and you guys and you know, we entertain...

AS: (inaudible)

CA: ...any questions that you have and discuss things and...

AS: I actually thought that we made it pretty clear.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

AS: That you know, that we wanted to talk to you. I mean obviously we can't come to you and ask you. But...

CA: Yeah I, understandably..

AS: ...you know I thought that you were aware ...that if you wanted to talk to anybody...

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

AS: That all you gotta do is simply ask.

CA: Yeah well I know it goes both ways on that and I guess it would've needed to come from me. I should've been the one I guess to come forward with it. But you know we did open up that door to law enforcement before. When Sergeant Allen was making a big deal saying, well we want to talk to her. He's saying, well the door is open.

AS: Hmm, I don't believe he was ever telling us the door was open. I mean..

CA: Well maybe not to you directly but I know to Sergeant Allen. I was sitting there even one of the time he spoke with him. So I've heard the words come out of his mouth even myself directed to other people that maybe didn't either relay the message or took it a different way. So I don't know. I think the lack of communication has put people in opposite corners when everybody has the same goal. Which is to find Caylee.

AS: Do you think the matter could have been resolved a bit differently?

CA: Absolutely in a lot of aspects. And that's a conversation that I've had not only with my attorney but with my family.

AS: Alright

CA: So I mean we all still feel, I as a Mom I know in my gut there's the feeling as a parent you know certain things about your child you can feel that connection. And I have still have that feeling that presence I know that she's alive. Whether you have a bucket load of evidence downstairs that contradicts that and says otherwise. Or all you have is speculation. Or, or nothing at all. I mean whatever that is there's still that chance with all these tips that have come through I know that it's been speculated how many thousands of tips have come through.

AS: There's been a lot.

CA: There have been a lot. I know I've seen the...

AS: But you also know how many have been....

CA: I know that a lot have been discredited but...

AS: We ran them down and....

CA: Is every...

AS: ..and we had more speculation.

CA: Has every tip been...

AS: And that's something...

CA: ..has every lead been followed up on?

AS: Jose directly..

CA: Yeah

AS: That we have more than speculation. We have a lot or else we wouldn't be to this point.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

AS: A lot.

CA: All I said, I said the same thing to them that you know they said we're at the end of a hallway. And I'm thinking we're at the end of a hallway and there are two doors. Which door are we going to go through or I guess this is you know we're at this point. And...

AS: We are at this point. We're (inaudible)

CA: The final step is which door is what?

AS: We are well beyond where we were before.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

AS: I mean those issues are gone okay.

(Corporal Edwards returns to the room)

AS: And when we refer to we're at the end of a hallway. I think you're well aware of what hallway we're talking about. Do you understand that?

CA: Um, well so there's a question I guess. You can specify that at this point. Or what your perspective is on that.

CE: You have a second?

AS: Oh absolutely.

CE: Can we come right back?

CA: Yeah that's fine.

CE: You planning on running off?

CA: I'm not going anywhere.

CE: I got to stretch out a little bit. I'm not as young as I used to be.

CA: (laugh)

AS: I can tell

CE: Oh I thought you were going to say something smart.

AS: No I was gonna ask if that was your Dr. Pepper or mountain dew or...

CE: I actually tried to give it to her she didn't want it.

CA: I, I'm perfectly fine, I...

CE: Do you want it?

AS: No, I..

CA:...don't drink soda so...

AS: ...was gonna ask...

CE: So we share it?

AS: We can.

CA: (laugh)

FA: Two straws? Or just?

AS: Sure.

CE: So I'll be right back. Do you want that or no 'cause if you don't...

CA: No

CE: Your Mom probably has one.

CA: She probably has one but I'm not gonna be with Mom probably, so..

CE: I'm pretty sure you're not gonna be with your Mom when you leave here. I don't want to mislead you there. That's...

CA: You're not misleading me at all. Which is why I...

CE: Unless your Mom runs me off the road on the way out of here then you may share a car trip down there.

CA: That's why I told my Mom to go home and not come here. She wanted to come here, so I mean...

CE: She, she knew you were coming here eventually.

CA: Um, I was the one that was telling her that I was coming here eventually. Just from the way...

CE: You had enough perception to turn the flashers on. I...that's...I applaud you for that.

AS: You did that?

CE: The only one (inaudible)...

CA: She didn't know how to put her flashers on. (laugh)

CE: It was pretty crazy out there.

CA: It's right on the center part of the dash.

CE: I've been in a lot of vehicle takedowns. That was similar to one. It was ridiculous. Wasn't it?

CA: Because I could help her out a little bit and help out whoever was behind her so they wouldn't hit her.

AS: I missed that.

CA: (laugh)

CE: Be back in a second okay?

(Detectives left the room)

(Detectives are waiting for Casey Anthony's attorney to get there for the interview)

(Corporal Edwards returned for a minute)

CE: Okay we're gonna be a few minutes 'cause we've got to wait for...

CA: Yeah that's fine.

CE: ...Mr. Baez to get here. Water? Anything?

CA: Nope I'm fine.

CE: You good?

CA: Yep

CE: Facilities?

CA: Nope I'm good.

CE: Okay

CA: Thanks

CE: Yep

AS: You see my (inaudible)...

CE: Yep they're right there.

CA: (laugh)

(Left again-----they're waiting for Mr. Baez to arrive.)

(They returned)

CA: Hey

AB: He's gonna ask you a question.

CA: okay

AB: And don't say anything other than the answer okay?

CE: Based on our conversation today, and I read you that form.

CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)

CE: It's just the same thing I said to Mr. Baez over the phone. Is...there have been numerous requests..or opportunities or requests for opportunities to speak with us and come to a resolution here. And that's why we brought you here and not to the jail, correct?

CA: Yes

CE: Okay. Based on your request for us to call him and bring him here, he's here. So what we're gonna try to do is give you a few minutes somewhere that's not recorded. No secrets I told you, this room is recorded.

CA: (inaudible)

CE: I have to be able to approach my chain and explain why. But first I needed you to tell him in your own words if you will. That you'd like to take the opportunity to deal with us like you made that request in the past. So is that something that you wanted to tell him?

CA: I told him the same thing that we talked about before that we would entertain any questions that they have. We would listen and discuss it and if we have something to respond, we respond.

AB: Okay, do you want to speak to me in private?

CA: Yes

AB: So we can clarify this.

CA: Yes

CE: Okay

AB: Have a seat

CE: Let me get my room to go let y'all just (inaudible)

CA: I'm just going to stand up for a second I've been sitting for an hour. Thank you.

CE: Alright

CA: (laugh)

AB: Thanks

CE: You're welcome.

(Left room)

(Someone came to the door to get Casey)

(Talking in hallway)

(Corporal Edwards came in and left room again)

(Everyone returned)

CA: (laugh) Funny.

CE: Have a seat.

AB: Okay

CE: We had a discussion.

CA: Okay

CE: You want to discuss that with her?

AB: Um, she knows.

CE: Okay

AB: I'll just go ahead and state for the record that, ah she's invoking her right to counsel. And at this time wishes to, ah, requests to go to jail and be processed.

CE: And we agreed on that at 4:22 in the afternoon already.

CA: Yes

CE: And that's why we called him. I don't have a problem with that.

AB: Okay

CE: You have any questions for me in regard to this? She signed that and we're good. Okay.

AB: No questions.

CE: Okay super. We'll be right with you.

CA: Okay

CE: Help yourself to some candy.  
AB: (inaudible) Listen, we're going to take you...  
CA: Uh-huh (affirmative)  
AB: Remember you're.....we're gonna take you right now so....  
CA: Okay  
AB: I'll visit you, if not tonight, sometime tomorrow.  
CA: Okay  
AB: Okay we'll see you soon.  
CA: Bye  
(Left room again)  
CE: Were working out getting you down there.  
CA: Alright  
CE: Okay  
CA: Yeah  
CE: I want to take you probably with the same ugly mugs that you already had to look at.  
CA: (laugh)  
CE: Okay  
CA: Thanks  
CE: Alright, are you wearing your coat out?  
AS: I always wear my coat.  
CE: See that's why I brought one.  
CA: (laugh)  
AS: Sorry  
CE: Did you bring a coat?  
CA: No  
ASB: I wear khakis and a t-shirt.  
FA: We're the FBI. You're so pretentious.  
CE: I looked that word up too.  
ASB: And you know what? You just need to carry one of those digital thesaurus and dictionaries around.  
CE: I am. (inaudible)  
AS: You guys. Okay that's probably recorded so..  
CE: Yeah I have evidence. Oh I have to handcuff you again.  
CA: Yes  
AS: You just try this.  
CE: Uh-huh (affirmative)  
CA: I don't care.  
AS: I drink a lot of coffee though.  
FA: I was gonna tell you, you need to do something about that.  
CE: What's that?  
FA: His breath.  
CA: (laugh)  
CE: Why did you wait so many years? Yeah we'll put 'em.....I'll tell you what.  
(Putting handcuffs on Casey to take her to jail)  
CE: Actually you know what? And this, this didn't work. (inaudible)  
AS: (inaudible)  
AS: We work terrorism.  
CA: (laugh) That's (inaudible)  
CE: Okay.

CA: Huh. Thanks

AS: You're welcome.

CE: Need this.

CA: Don't lose that.

ASB: Nick Savage, the gentleman.

CE: Need that. Take this and the radio.

FA: (inaudible)

CE: Okay well let's head out. After you Ma'am. Take a right. Dottie downstairs?

(Every one left room)

(Talking in hallway)

(Leaving to take Casey Anthony to jail)
